# PFT 402: Mindfulness-Based Play-Family Therapy





- Final Year, 2024-25. The Mindfulness-Based Play-Family Therapy Training Program has been running at the Family Center since Dottie Higgins Klein started teaching it in 1996. The 2024-25 academic year will be the last time that the is offered. The Family & Play therapy Center will still offer supervision services in MBPFT as well as some trainings live online. We expect to continue these support services for therapists and therapy for all ages for five more years.
- Should I take MBPFT 402 if I have not taken the 401 year? While the complete program included two years, each year stands as an independent educational experience, and some students over the years have chosen to take just one of the years. For those who want further education and guidance in applying the MBFPT framework, ongoing supervision offers a way to keep growing and learning.

- PFT 402 is a one-year course with 12 three-hour long classes, every other week from September through April. Although the original PFT program was two years, 401 and 402, each year has a different focus and is able to stand alone: this year's 402 course will give students a comprehensive training that will enable them to incorporate Play-Family Therapy into their practice. If you have questions about the course, you are welcome to talk with Dottie.
- Ratings: Participant ratings for the PFT courses average 4.7 out of 5.
- **Video Replay Webinars:** Participation in class through our video replay webinars is available from anywhere in the world and is recognized by the APT as Play Therapy Specific non-contact hours. In the table at the end of this course description, you will find CE details, reasonable cost, and significant geographic discounts scaled to match the economies of most countries around the world.
- **Live Group Supervision:** The PFT 402 curriculum includes 4 hours of face-to-face, small group supervision, for personal connection with a senior RPT-S therapist which allows to integrate the course material. Supervision can be in person on site, or live online, depending on your location.
- Classroom Ambiance: The webinars consist of presentations that were filmed in front of a live classroom audience. The teacher-class interaction provides a lively context and expands the range of the presentations with questions and answers that arise from broad group experience. There is also a chat room which allows dialogue among the actual online participants during the webinars. And our website has a Community Group where you can communicate with other class members; or contact Dottie Higgins-Klein with questions or comments about the training. Dottie welcomes phone contact as well, and will continue to offer therapy, supervision and occasional onsite trainings for at least the next five years.
- **Demonstration Videos:** Family Center trainings are outstanding in their instructional use of videos that demonstrate application of the theory: most classes include extensive video segments of actual play therapy sessions and some parent/child meetings.
- **APT Approved Provider 96-030** -- Family & Play Therapy Center has been approved by the Association for Play Therapy (APT) as an approved provider for continuing education since 1996. Director, Dottie Higgins-Klein, was awarded the professional training and education award for 2015 by the APT.
- **Child Development:** The theory of Child Development is a crucial part of the Play-Family Therapy psychodynamic framework, connecting early attachment experiences to the issues of a child coming to play therapy at an older age.



#### Overview

The first class to go through this program graduated in 1997, and the program has continually been approved by the APT since that time. Throughout the years, graduates have expressed immense satisfaction and appreciation for allthat they learned. The course has been updated with current knowledge. An overview that combines the theory and practice is available in Dottie's book, *Mindfulness-Based Play-Family Therapy: Theory and Practice* (Norton 2013 and the first 8 pages, can be viewed on Amazon).

The Play Therapy theories in the course include: Psychodynamic, Humanistic, and Cognitive-Behavioral, child-centered and filial, object relations and developmental, and mindfulness-based, both directed and spontaneous play therapy, interpersonal neurobiology specific to play therapy, attachment and trauma-informed play therapy, and family systemic theories supporting play therapy.

The three-hour classes include Seminal Theories and Play Therapy skills and methods, demonstrated by viewing real videos of play therapy with interactive methods, with the focus of special topics to convey the theories. The classes integrate theory and practice -- play therapy skills AND concrete methods with interactive components.

Mindfulness-Based Play-Family Therapy offers a solid and comprehensive theoretical framework. The eclectic in-depth approach integrates:

- Developmental Approach to Attachment & Trauma Theory Mahler's landmark 20 years of research onthe development of attachment in the first three years of life; also Bowlby, Brody, Gil, Levy & Orlans, and Allan Schore's landmark research on affect regulation and the development of shame.
- Sandtray Play Therapy: Appreciates the value of sandtray therapy and builds on spontaneous, child-centered, mindful and somatic approaches. Sandtray theory and practice are woven into this course and expanded in our Sandtray Certificate Program.
- IPNB: Inter-Personal Neurobiology: Badenoch/ Siegel/van der Kolk/ Perry.
- Talk Time & Mindful Parent Meetings include: Cognitive Behavioral skills: Family Therapy approaches; Nagy/ Minuchin /Hughes /strong support with parent child collaterals. Ross Green's work with aggression and working with oppositional defiance and temper tantrums. The extensive training in Mindful Parenting helps parents see their side of the problems their child is presenting. Parents appreciate this experience: it keeps them more engaged, and they tend to keep the child in treatment longer to get to root level issues.
- This multi-faceted, **deeper awareness approach** offers a strong theoretical framework with interventions and practices that are evidence-supported and evidence-based.
- **PowerPoint** theory and sandtray video demonstrations are unique each year and allow students to go more deeply into this solid, multi-layered theoretical framework. Students receive power point handouts.
- Face to face group supervision (4 hours each year) offers personal contact with Dottie or a very experienced RPT-S supervisor to help therapists to integrate the theory. The supervisors are also graduates of the PFT program.
  - **Credential:** We offer our own credential and participants also earn non-contact play-therapy hours that are required for becoming a Registered Play Therapist.
  - **Developing your framework:** Therapists have taken our trainings to enrich their knowledge and further develop their own framework. They comment with high satisfaction the solid theoretical framework this course provides and particularly appreciate the extensive use of actualvideos.
    - A primary goal is for each therapist to develop a personal theoretical framework that solidly integrates his or her unique interests and discipline. We offer a thorough, deeper experience, with multiple videos from actual client sessions. Our reasonable pace (and reasonable price) is not recommended for those who want to rush to get credentials. As a post graduate training, our goal is to help therapists integrate the theory within their own practice, during the two-week period between classes.

  - Who joins this program? - APT CEs: PFT 402 offers a total of 36 play therapy specific, non-contact CEs for APT.
- **Family Systems:** An awareness of systemic family therapy is woven throughout the course. The child development component provides the therapist with an essential foundation for understanding the root causes of children's presenting problems. This foundation guides the therapist's understanding of the child's attachment and trauma history, as well as the mindful parenting process, which helps parents understand their side of the presenting issues.
- Attendance Document to apply for RPT: Following each year, the Center provides documents that detail the student's record of attendance, names of presenters, and individual class topics, with notation of play therapy specific hours. This document can be used in the application for RPT credential. Participants can select categories that match their APT credentialing needs for: A-Play Therapy Skills & Methods, B-Play Therapy Special Topics, or C-Applicant's Choice.
- Small Group Supervision: 4 hours are provided by experienced RPT-S Supervisors. This **face-to-face videoconferencing** takes place by Zoom. There is optional onsite supervision available for students attending near Philadelphia area.
- PA CEs for LSW, LMFT, & LPCs, which may be accepted in other states.

#### **PFT 402 Course Objectives**

*This course is designed to help participants be able to:* 

- 1. Utilize the child's developmental history in an initial meeting with parents to inform parents how any past issues may be relevant to the current play therapy process.
- 2. List the aspects of normal child development, particularly understanding Reactive Attachment Disorder in children attending play therapy.
- 3. Adapt the developmental assessment of a child in play therapy to address specific issues present within the family of the child who is in Play Therapy, such as issues of stepfamilies, families with divorce, and sexual abuse.
- 4. Record and use a genogram to shed light on the multi-cultural background of the child in play therapy.
- 5. Explain to parents how the parents' issues, as noted in the family history, may be related to issues that the child is bringing to the play therapy.
- 6. Describe the importance of the four-segment evaluation as the first part of the play therapy.
- 7. Demonstrate the therapist's use of language and silence in directed and spontaneous play therapy.
- 8. Evaluate the meaning of children's language and metaphors as they develop in the play, through having viewed many course videos of real-life play therapy sessions that demonstrate language metaphors in the play.
- 9. Identify essential family systems concepts of Contextual Family Therapy, particularly loyalty and split loyalty, parentification, multi-partiality, destructive entitlement, and exoneration as these concepts impact a child in play therapy.
- 10. Apply Contextual family systems concepts to the child's play therapy process and to the therapist's dialogue with parents about the roots of presenting problems and ways to address them.
- 11. Apply techniques for Talk Time (parent-child collaterals), including Cognitive Behavioral Play Therapy techniques to be used in the therapy office, at home using video conferencing, in hospice or hospital setting, and in schools.
- 12. Explain how interpersonal neurobiology and the theory of affect regulation interface with Play Therapy theory.
- 13. Apply a multi-cultural mindset to the real needs of families from a variety of cultural backgrounds of children in play therapy.
- 14. Describe the theory of attachment and the play therapy approach to addressing attachment disorder, including disorganized or insecure attachment, with the child and their family.
- 15. Apply Play and Sandtray modalities with trauma-informed theory, in a child-centered, mindful approach to both spontaneous and directed play therapy.
- 16. Recognize symptoms of ADHD, ADD, OCD, and Severe anxiety in children coming for play therapy.



- 17. Plan applications for working with children on autism spectrum and specific techniques that benefit these children through play therapy.
- 18. List concrete ways to address the issues of children with Developmental Delays and describe how these children may benefit from a directed approach to play therapy.
- 19. Discuss how play therapy can address sexual abuse, using an understanding of play metaphors in the play of the sexual abuse victim.
- 20. Create practical applications in play therapy to work with Temper Tantrums and Affect Dysregulation.
- 21. Educate Parents to work constructively at home with temper tantrums of children coming to play therapy.
- 22. Describe theory of the Deeper Awareness Stage in the Play Therapy, where the greatest healing of trauma and attachment issues can occur.
- 23. Recognize when the deeper awareness stage manifests and be able to engage it with applications of child centered, mindful play therapy.
- 24. Describe and recognize how the Integration stage differs from the Deeper Awareness stage and can begin to indicate that the Closure stage is nearer.
- 25. Explain the meaning and value of the closure stage of play therapy and demonstrate this with a video.

#### PFT 402 CEs for APT

**PFT 402 offers a total of 36 play therapy specific**, **non-contact CEs.** These 36 CEs also apply toward the Family & Play Therapy Center certification in Play-Family Therapy, earned upon completion of the two-year program.

Students also receive a list of required and recommended books, and professional resources are provided to students to supplement the theory.

#### **Course Withdrawal Policy:**







### COURSE WITHDRAWAL & PAYMENT POLICIES

#### **Course Withdrawal Policy for Academic Term Courses:**

Academic Term Courses are courses that meet over the span of several months on a biweekly or monthly basis. Tuition is composed of (i) a deposit, which must be paid at the time of registration, and (ii) installments, which may be paid according to the schedule described in the course brochure.

- (a) If participant withdraws prior to four weeks before the first day of a course, then participant will receive a refund of the paid deposit and installments, minus a \$50 withdrawal fee.
- (b) If participant withdraws within four weeks of the first day of a course, but earlier than one week before the first day, then participant will receive a refund of paid installments and a credit in the amount of the paid deposit to be applied to future training or supervision at the center, minus a \$50 withdrawal fee.
- (c) If participant withdraws within one week before the first day of a course or on the first day of a course, then participant will receive a refund of paid installments and a credit in the amount of the paid deposit to be applied to future training or supervision at the center, minus a \$100 withdrawal fee.
- (d) Following the first day of a course, participant is committed from completing the course, and participant is responsible for payment of full yearly course tuition. Full course tuition is not reduced on account of absences; however, participant may attend missed classes with no charge during the next time that the class is offered in the recurring cycle of the curriculum.
- (e) A late fee will be assessed for past-due balances and late payments. See our payment plan brochure for details.

## **Course Withdrawal Policy for Short Term Courses:**

Short Term Courses are courses and seminars that meet over the span of one to five contiguous days. Tuition is composed of (i) a deposit, which must be paid at the time of registration, and (ii) installments, which may be paid according to the schedule described in the course brochure.

- (a) If participant withdraws prior to four weeks before the first day of a course, then participant will receive a refund of the paid deposit and tuition, minus a \$50 withdrawal fee.
- (b) If participant withdraws within four weeks of the first day of a course, but earlier than one week before the first day, then participant will receive a refund of paid installments and a credit in the amount of the paid deposit to be applied to future training or supervision at the center, minus a \$50 withdrawal fee.
- (c) If participant withdraws within one week before the first day of a course or on the first day of a course, then participant forfeits either (i) \$150 or (ii) half of the paid deposit and installments, whichever is greater, and will receive a credit in the amount the remaining paid deposit and installments.
- (d) Following the first day of a course, participant is committed to completing the course, and participant is responsible for payment of full course tuition. Full course tuition is not reduced on account of absences.
- (e) A 1% late fee for past-due balances will be assessed at the end of each month, based on the amount past due on the last day of the month.

# **Payment Plan for Academic Term Courses**

The Family Center offers a payment plan for Academic Term Courses. Upon registration for the course, registrant pays the deposit. The tuition balance can be paid either in 8 monthly installments starting on September 1, or in a one-time payment on September 1 (or upon registration, whichever date is later). The installment plan is charged by the Center in our administrative office and there is no extra fee for this plan.
