## Overview

Over fifteen years ago, Kevin O’Conner addressed the issue of play therapists becoming more culturally competent. “Play therapists are called on both to address cultural issues in play therapy and to facilitate children’s pride in, and preservation of, their culture.” He encouraged play therapists to understand the concept of culture and its impact on the therapist’s own life. In a more recent exceptional resource, *Multicultural Play Therapy Making the Most of Cultural Opportunities with Children, 2022*, Dee Ray, Yumiko Ogawa, and Yi-Ju Cheng expand play therapists’ cultural awareness, humility, and competence to work more effectively with children of diverse cultures, races, and belief systems.

## Highlights — Meeting the challenges of race, caste, and ethnic differences

- Basic Definitions to create a theoretical framework.
- The ongoing nature of cultural competence – with appreciation of MCO, Multicultural Orientation Framework of Cultural Humility, Competence & Comfort (Owen et al).
- The therapists’ awareness of the client family and of the therapist’s own racial/ethnic/cultural history.
- Cultural Humility that includes the therapist’s willingness to learn from each client’s experiences.
- The Playroom as a Multicultural experience.
- Practical applications for the play therapist to engage children and their families and to open to a personal, transparent experience with self that may or may not be shared in the seminar.
- Struggle with both identity and affirmation for both the therapist and child, and also for the people in the child’s life system. (E.Gil, A.Drewes)
- Play therapy that can specifically enact a child’s conscious and unconscious injustices.
- Issues of immigration, adoption, and the value of biculturalism.
- Affirming the strengths of multiracial families.
- Effects on the limbic system in persons of white privilege and in victims of prejudice.
- Acknowledging historic injustices: for example, toward Native Americans and other indigenous peoples,



toward African Americans, Great Famine vs. Irish Genocide, Japanese Internment, the Holocaust ... and many others in our world history.

- Seminar will include one video of a session with clients.

### Objectives

Course participants will be able to:

- Define basic concepts of Play Therapy related to racial, ethnic, and cultural competence.
- Demonstrate how the play therapist can integrate cultural awareness in their play therapy and when working with families.
- Nurture a play therapy environment that can be multiculturally friendly.
- Demonstrate, in the play therapy, cultural humility, which includes the therapist’s willingness to learn from each client’s experiences.
- Recommend and review literature that can guide parents of children in play therapy in their understanding of the transmission of values appropriate for the world of today.
- Describe the need for the somatic (not just cognitive) play therapy interventions for families attending play therapy with their children and teens.
- Predict how the steady continuity of healing opportunities in Play Family Therapy can help the problem of ethnic disparity to create a more equitable society.
- Address issues of immigration and adoption, affirming the value of biculturalism and the strengths of multiracial families.

### Instructor

Dottie Higgins Klein LMFT, RPT-S and AAMFT supervisor, is the director of the & Play Therapy Center in Philadelphia, where the program in Play-Family Therapy has been offered continuously since 1995. She is author of *Mindfulness-Based Play-Family Therapy: Theory and Practice*, Norton, 2013. Dottie is also clinical and administrative director of the counseling center at the FPT Center. She was awarded the APT Professional Training and Education Award for 2015.

Dottie has been dedicated to multicultural awareness throughout her adult life. As a young woman in the late 60s and early 70s, Dottie was an elementary school teacher in two ethnically diverse areas and spent her summers as assistant director of a summer camp that brought together 150 children from three racially distinct neighborhoods into a beautiful campus on the edge of the city.

She and her husband chose to live, work, and raise their children in the Philadelphia neighborhood of Mount Airy, “one of the first successfully integrated neighborhoods in America. Mount Airy residents organized to resist blockbusting, panic selling, and redlining, especially during the period from the late 1950s to the early 1970s when those practices were prevalent.” (Wikipedia) She has had a lifelong interest in travel aimed at encountering people in other cultures, including a year teaching high school in Zaire, Africa (now Congo).

In her career as a therapist, Dottie has kept the conscious intention of working to heal the effects of the caste system in America that come from many generations of social inequity and prejudice. This class in multi-cultural competence is intended to help further the development of each therapist’s individual mode of navigating this challenging area in our contemporary society, starting from an attitude of humility and respect.

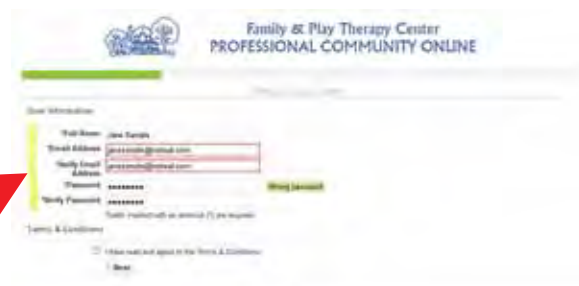

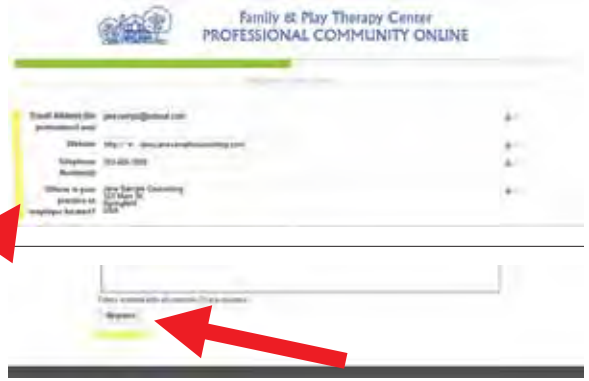
5. Click box to indicate agreement to terms. Click "Terms & Conditions" link to read terms.



6. Click "Next" button.

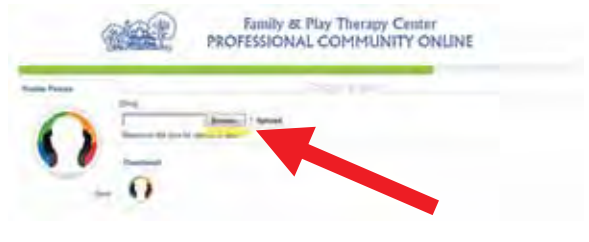

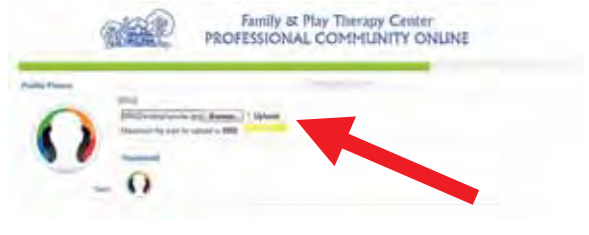


8. When you have completed this information, click the "Register" button at the bottom of the page.

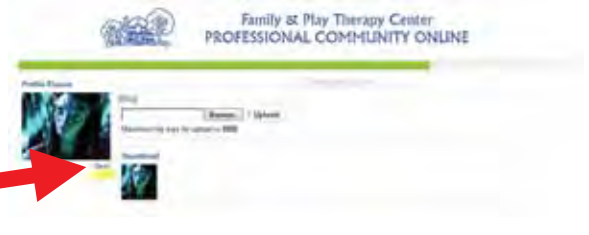

## **How to Register Online for Courses and Seminars**

**NOTE:** The entire registration process takes place over a secure, encrypted connection in order to ensure the privacy of your information, and we will never share your registration information with anyone else.

### **1. Create a Profile**

In order to register for courses and seminars through our website ([www.fptcenter.com](http://www.fptcenter.com)), **you must have a profile in our community site** (Professional Community Online). If you already have a profile, go on to step 2. If you do not yet have a profile, please click the help button on our website ([www.fptcenter.com](http://www.fptcenter.com)) and follow the instructions for creating a profile. It's free and takes only a few minutes!

### **2. Log in to the Professional Community Online**

## COURSE WITHDRAWAL & PAYMENT POLICIES

### Course Withdrawal Policy for Academic Term Courses:

*Academic Term Courses are courses that meet over the span of several months on a biweekly or monthly basis. Tuition is composed of (i) a deposit, which must be paid at the time of registration, and (ii) installments, which may be paid according to the schedule described in the course brochure.*

- (a) If participant withdraws prior to four weeks before the first day of a course, then participant will receive a refund of the paid deposit and installments, minus a \$50 withdrawal fee.
- (b) If participant withdraws within four weeks of the first day of a course, but earlier than one week before the first day, then participant will receive a refund of paid installments and a credit in the amount of the paid deposit to be applied to future training or supervision at the center, minus a \$50 withdrawal fee.
- (c) If participant withdraws within one week before the first day of a course or on the first day of a course, then participant will receive a refund of paid installments and a credit in the amount of the paid deposit to be applied to future training or supervision at the center, minus a \$100 withdrawal fee.
- (d) Following the first day of a course, participant is committed from completing the course, and participant is responsible for payment of full yearly course tuition. Full course tuition is not reduced on account of absences; however, participant may attend missed classes with no charge during the next time that the class is offered in the recurring cycle of the curriculum.
- (e) A late fee will be assessed for past-due balances and late payments. See our payment plan brochure for details.

### Course Withdrawal Policy for Short Term Courses:

*Short Term Courses are courses and seminars that meet over the span of one to five contiguous days. Tuition is composed of (i) a deposit, which must be paid at the time of registration, and (ii) installments, which may be paid according to the schedule described in the course brochure.*

- (a) If participant withdraws prior to four weeks before the first day of a course, then participant will receive a refund of the paid deposit and tuition, minus a \$50 withdrawal fee.
- (b) If participant withdraws within four weeks of the first day of a course, but earlier than one week before the first day, then participant will receive a refund of paid installments and a credit in the amount of the paid deposit to be applied to future training or supervision at the center, minus a \$50 withdrawal fee.
- (c) If participant withdraws within one week before the first day of a course or on the first day of a course, then participant forfeits either (i) \$150 or (ii) half of the paid deposit and installments, whichever is greater, and will receive a credit in the amount the remaining paid deposit and installments.
- (d) Following the first day of a course, participant is committed to completing the course, and participant is responsible for payment of full course tuition. Full course tuition is not reduced on account of absences.
- (e) A 1% late fee for past-due balances will be assessed at the end of each month, based on the amount past due on the last day of the month.

## **Payment Plan for Academic Term Courses**

The Family Center offers a payment plan for Academic Term Courses. Upon registration for the course, registrant pays the deposit. The tuition balance can be paid either in 8 monthly installments starting on September 1, or in a one-time payment on September 1 (or upon registration, whichever date is later). The installment plan is charged by the Center in our administrative office and there is no extra fee for this plan.
